Prime Minister Abe at G7 Summit

On Aug. 24-26, Prime Minister Shinzo Abe met with fellow Group of Seven nations leaders for a summit in Biarritz, France. On the sidelines of these talks, Abe held a summit with U.S. President Donald Trump,

and convened bilateral talks with the leaders of the U.K., Chile, Australia, France, Canada and Germany.

The Ninth Trilateral Foreign Ministers' Meeting between Japan, China and South Korea) was held in Gubei Water Town in

China on Aug. 21. The three ministers' discussions included their shared intention to work closely together regarding developments surrounding North Korea.



Spotlight on TICAD (Tokyo International Conference on African Development)

Since 1993, Japan has been hosting the TICAD conferences, also co-hosted by United Nations, United Nations Development Program (UNDP), World Bank and African

Union Commission (AUC). TICAD has been a successful forum, leading to projects with a strong track record of improving social and economic conditions in Africa, mainly through grant aid and technical assistance. In projects identified through this dialogue, Japan's government has, for instance, built thousands of schools, built and improved thousands of medical facilities, and provided access to safe drinking water to millions of people. The most recent TICAD was held August 28th - 30th in Yokohama, Japan.

Mounded Tombs of Ancient Japan Added to UNESCO World Heritage List

Japan's Furuichi-Mozu Kofungun, or mounded tombs of ancient Japan above the Osaka Plain, were officially recognized by UNESCO as a World Heritage site. The mounted tombs "are the richest tangible representation of the culture of the Kofun period in Japan from the 3rd to 6th centuries," according to UNESCO. The Mozu kofun (Sakai) are on the coast, while the Furuichi tombs (Habikino and Fujiidera) are about 6.2 miles inland to the east. Both areas are accessible by train, a great addition to any trip to the Osaka area!
