Prime Minister Suga Congratulates US President-Elect Biden in Phone Call

On Nov. 12, Prime Minister SUGA Yoshihide spoke with US President-Elect Joe Biden on the phone,

congratulating him and Vice President-Elect Kamala Harris on their election. Suga conveyed to Biden that the Japan-U.S. Alliance is indispensable for the peace and prosperity of both the region surrounding Japan, and that Japan and the US should further strengthen the Alliance. Suga also expressed his wish for Japan and the US to work together to realize a 'Free and Open Indo-Pacific.' Biden said he looks forward to working together to further strengthen the Japan-US Alliance, and achieve the peace and stability of the Indo-Pacific region.

their determination to stage safe and secure Olympic Games in 2021. Bach noted that Japan had shown its ability organize sporting events in a safe environment, giving him the belief that the games will on with spectators in the stands. "We are looking for a reasonable number of spectators at the time of the Games," Bach said at a news conference. On Nov. 17, he toured the Olympic Village, the Olympic Stadium and Japan Olympic Museum, meeting with Japanese athletes.

On Nov. 12, Consul General Muto gave opening remarks at the first VerdeXchange Institute hydrogen forum, "Green Energy in LA and Beyond." This virtual event -featuring elected leaders including Congressman Mike Levin, private company CEO's, and other thought leaders active in the creation of a new hydrogen energy sector consisted of three panels and break-out networking sessions with speakers and audience members. Consul General Muto kicked off the event, which was co-presented by the Consulate of Japan, with an overview of Japan's leadership and support of the global effort in hydrogen energy, supported by examples of Japanese cooperation already taking place in southern California. Toyota Motors North America and Mitsubishi Power Americas described their groundbreaking projects in mobility, goods movement, and hydrogen-fueled, utility-scaled power generation. Mayor Eric Garcetti's remarks to Japan's Ministerial level conference on Hydrogen were also shared as a timely message on cooperation between Japan and Los Angeles in this growing energy sector.
