

### PM Kishida Delivers Policy Speech to the 205th Diet Session

On Oct. 8, Prime Minister Kishida delivered a policy speech to the 205th Session of the Diet during plenary sessions of the House of Representatives and the House of Councillors. He discussed diplomacy and security policies that aim to fully protect the Japanese people as being among the priority policy areas of his Cabinet. He noted a determination to fully defend the universal values of freedom, democracy,

human rights, and the rule of law. And he vowed to vigorously promote a "Free and Open Indo-Pacific" in cooperation with Japan's allies such as the U.S., Australia, India, and the countries of ASEAN and Europe.



### Japan, US Leaders Hold Phone Summit

On Oct. 5, Prime Minister Kishida spoke on the phone with US President Joseph R. Biden. The two leaders agreed on the importance of further strengthening the Japan-U.S. Alliance. They also

shared the view to further strengthen the Alliance's deterrence and response capability to address the increasingly severe security environment in the region. Regarding regional issues such as China and North Korea, the two leaders noted they would coordinate closely based on the Japan-US Joint Leaders' Statement issued in April.



### Video Meeting With 2021 Nobel Prize Recipient in Physics

On Oct. 8, 2021, the Prime Minister held an online meeting Dr. MANABE Syukuro, Princeton University Senior Meteorologist and JAMSTEC (Japan Agency for Marine-Earth Science and

#### Japan, US Foreign Ministers' Telephone Talk

On Oct. 7, Foreign Minister MOTEGI Toshimitsu and US Secretary of State Antony Blinken spoke by phone. The two ministers confirmed that they would continue to cooperate in strengthening the Japan-U.S. Alliance and realizing a "Free and Open Indo-Pacific." Furthermore, both

sides exchanged a wide range of views on regional issues, such as North Korea and China, and cooperation on dealing with climate change.

The pace of vaccinations is accelerating in Japan, with over 187.8 million doses administered to date to the general public as of Oct. 28 and 71.4% of the population now fully

vaccinated.



# Namie and Lancaster Celebrate Smart Sister City Agreement and Join International Hydrogen Ministerial Meeting

Following upon their Smart Sister City agreement in July, on October 1st, 2021, the Namie Town in Fukushima Prefecture, and Lancaster California, reconfirmed their



ambitions to become the world's first "Smart Sister Cities" pledging collaboration and mutual efforts in building a hydrogen energy sector in their respective cities and nations. On October 4th, soon after signing their agreement, both cities participated in the International Hydrogen Ministerial Summit, hosted annually by Japan,

where they were recognized for their efforts and partnership going forward. Mayor Parris in his remarks indicated that the ultimate plan for Lancaster would be to convert public buildings and residences to hydrogen power, and are on the verge of laying out the plan to achieve these ambitious goals. He indicated that cities were the key to fighting climate change, and that Lancaster's example could serve as a template for other cities wishing to convert to clean energy. Mayor Yoshida of Namie confirmed their historic commitment and promote their "Smart Sister Cities" initiative to advance clean hydrogen technology at the municipal level. Namie is involved in an ambitious program to generate and utilize hydrogen within the city and indicated the city intends to continue to push forward as the front-runner in this effort.



### Select LA Investment Summit Convenes

The World Trade Center Los Angeles convened the annual Select LA Investment Summit, with this year's theme focusing on the "business of sports," seeking to leverage and build upon the growing number of teams and the many major sporting events slated to take place in Los Angeles in the near to medium term, including the Super Bowl in 2022 and the Olympic and Paralympic Games in 2028. Japan's recent Olympics and the role of Japan as the region's largest source

October 18th – 19th, the event featured, sake, shochu, beer, liquor, marine products, seasonings, ramen, udon, tea, ice confectionery, rice, alternative meats, etc. As the first major event to be be scheduled in over a year due to COVID restrictions, guests from a variety of food related businesses enjoyed the opportunity to have an authentic and tactile food experience, as it is impossible to determine the characteristics of a food or beverage product other than by actually sampling in person.
