Prime Minister Kishida Attends COP26

On Nov. 2, Prime Minister KISHIDA Fumio attended the World Leaders Summit, a summitlevel meeting of the COP26 (26th Session of the Conference of the Parties to the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change) held in Glasgow, United Kingdom. Kishida said that

Japan will work fully to take on climate change. On the sidelines of COP26, the prime minister met with counterparts from such nations as Australia and the UK.



Prime Minister Forms 2nd Cabinet

The second Kishida Cabinet was inaugurated on Nov. 10. Prime Minister Kishida said he would respond to the mandate of the people, and that Japan's immediate priority is to deal with the COVID-19 pandemic and to implement economic measures. He also said the government will launch a new form of capitalism to realize growth, the fruit of which can be felt by each citizen. Japan will also promote diplomacy and security that fully protects Japan's peace and security, according to Kishida. Read his statement <u>HERE</u>.

Prime Minister Kishida at the G20 Rome Summit

Prime Minister Kishida participated in the G20 Rome Summit, held Oct. 30-31, and presented on Japan's efforts in such areas as global health and climate change. The prime minister introduced Japan's pledge of \$1 billion US

dollars announced at the COVID-19 Vaccine Global Access (COVAX) Advance Market Commitment (AMC) Summit co-hosted by Japan in June this year. The Prime Minister also explained about Japan's decisions to provide up to approximately 60 million doses of vaccine in total and cold chain equipment to 59 countries and regions, and its swift implementation of these assistances.

Japan at the East Asian Summit, ASEAN-Related Meetings

On Oct. 27, Prime Minister Kishida attended via video conference the <u>16th East Asia</u> <u>Summit</u>, as well as the <u>24th ASEAN-Japan</u> <u>Summit Meeting</u> and <u>24th ASEAN Plus Three</u> (Japan, China, Korea) Summit. At the EAS

Summit, Prime Minister Kishida said that he will work with EAS leaders to vigorously advance a "free and open Indo-Pacific." He also reiterated that he would do the same with ASEAN leaders. At the ASEAN Plus Three meeting, the Prime Minister said that regarding medical support for the COVID-19 response, in addition to contributions to the COVID-19 ASEAN Response Fund, Japan is further offering assistance worth more than \$200 million US dollars by providing medical supplies and equipment, and developing cold chains.

In Japan, over 196 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines have been administered to date to the general public as of Nov. 29, with 76.97% of the population now fully vaccinated. As of Nov. 29, COVID-19 cases to date came to 1,726,479 in Japan, and 48,253,807 in the United States, according to the Coronavirus Resource Center, Johns Hopkins University & Medicine.

Japanese firms shared best case examples of their activities worldwide, and their growing dedication to this growing energy sub-sector here in California.


