

Foreign Minister Motegi in Europe

Foreign Minister MOTEGI Toshimitsu visited
Europe from April 29 to May 8, a trip that
included his attendance at the Meeting of Group
of Seven Foreign and Development Ministers
and the 7th Meeting of Ministers of Foreign

Affairs of the Visegrad Group (V4) plus Japan. He also attended numerous bilateral meetings with his counterparts from Slovenia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, the U.K., India, Australia, Italy, South Korea, France, EU, Germany, Canada, Poland, the Slovak Republic, Hungary and the Czech Republic.



Foreign Min, USTR Tai Discuss Vaccines

On May 19, Foreign Minister Motegi spoke on the phone with Ambassador Katherine C. Tai, United States Trade Representative, about intellectual

property protection of COVID-19 vaccines. Motegi noted Japan's position of placing importance on promptly realizing the expansion of international production of vaccines, and the assurance of fair and equitable access. Furthermore, Japan intends to proceed

with initiatives such as contributing to the COVAX Facility. The two agreed that Japan and the US would cooperate closely regarding international initiatives on vaccines.



JAXA Astronaut Returns to Earth

Having completed his long-duration mission on the International Space Station, Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency (JAXA) Astronaut NOGUCHI Soichi returned safely to Earth aboard The Crew Dragon spacecraft, which landed on May 2 off the coast of Panama City, Florida.

Latest on COVID-19 in Japan

Japan's Declaration of the State of Emergency in response to COVID-19 is in place as of May 24 in the following prefectures: Tokyo, Kyoto, Osaka, Hyogo, Aichi, Fukuoka, Hokkaido, Okayama, Hiroshima and Okinawa.

As of May 28, COVID-19 deaths in the US stood at 180.75 per 100,000, while the figure for Japan was at 10.05 per 100,000, according to data from Johns Hopkins University Coronavirus Resource Center.

Car Companies Pursue Another Type of Hydrogen Vehicle!

Compared to gasoline or diesel, hydrogen combustion is effectively emissions free. In order to leverage already developed existing technology

chains and employment, Japanese firms are exploring the possibilities of fueling internal combustion engines with hydrogen, and are seeking a proof of concept in the high powered and demanding world of competitive auto racing – a move particularly supported by Toyota President, Akio Toyoda.

Starting at the grueling Fuji Super TEC 24 Hours race, Japan's first hydrogen powered race car was fielded by Toyota May 21st-23rd. This event marked the first time in the world that carbon-neutral fuel (hydrogen) was used in a 24-hour endurance race; and the fuel was also notable for having been created at the world's largest green hydrogen production site, the FH2R project in Namie Town, Fukushima Prefecture.

SuihoEn The Japanese Garden

Located in Van Nuys, CA, the Japanese Garden is a public garden that features a dry Zen meditation garden containing Tortoise Island, a three-Buddha arrangement of stones, and a wisteria arbor at the end of the Plover Path. The garden also features a "wet-strolling" garden, with waterfalls, lakes and streams, abundant greenery, and stone lanterns. There is also the Shoin Building with a teahouse and adjacent tea garden. Adjacent to a water reclamation plant, the Garden's purpose was "to demonstrate a positive use of reclaimed water in what is generally agreed to be a delicate environment," according to the Garden's website.
