Prime Minister Attends Video Conference to Discuss the Situation in Ukraine

On April 19, Prime Minister KISHIDA Fumio attended a summit-level video conference to

discuss the situation in Ukraine with leaders of such countries as the United States, the United Kingdom, Germany, France, Italy and Poland.



Foreign Minister Hayashi Attends NATO and G7 Foreign Ministers' Meetings

On April 7, Foreign Minister HAYASHI Yoshimasa met with North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) ministers of foreign affairs in Belgium. He also attended a

Group of Seven (G7) Foreign Ministers' meeting, which was held just prior to the NATO meeting. On the sidelines of NATO and G-7 gatherings, Minister Hayashi held bilateral meetings with counterparts, including U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken.



Japan Stands with Ukraine

On April 26, <u>Prime Minister Kishida held a</u> <u>summit telephone talk with Ukraine President</u> <u>Volodymyr Zelenskyy</u>. Kishida explained that in response to the Ukrainian government's request, Japan has increased financial assistance from US\$100 million to US\$300

million to support the economy, and that Japan Self-Defense Forces (JSDF) equipment, such as small drones and protective masks and suits against chemical weapons have been provided.



Consul General's Commendation Conferred on Mr. Yuji Takahashi

On April 25, the Consulate General of Japan in Los Angeles presented the Commendation of the Consul General to Mr. Yuji Takahashi. The Commendation of the Consul General was

established to recognize an individual or group who has helped advance the mission of the Consulate General and has provided significant contributions to mutual understanding and promoting friendship between Japan and the United States. Mr. Takahashi has contributed unparalleled cooperation with the local community and Japanese companies for 27 years since 1995. In particular, as Executive Director of the Japanese Business Association (JBA) since 2007, he has contributed to the cooperation with the local community, JBA membership companies, and government officials for 14 years.





"Japanese Food Export Support Platform" Established

On April 26th, the world's first "Japanese Food Export Support Platform" was established in the United States. The Consulate General of Japan in Los Angeles and the JETRO Los Angeles office will work together to provide professional and continuous support for the export efforts of Japanese food products with this organization. At the ceremony, the launch of this export support platform in the United States, and its immediate activities, was announced, with Consul General Akira Muto, and Atsushi Suginaka, the Export Promotion Deputy Director-General of the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries, in Los Angeles. Confirmed that Japanese food-related organizations and JETRO Los Angeles office will sign the "Memorandum for Expansion of Japanese Food" (MOU), and that the public and private sectors will work together to promote Japanese food in order to support exports.

Latest on COVID-19 in Japan: Vaccinations Up

In Japan, over 270 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines have been administered to date to the general public as of April 28, 2022 with 80.20% of the population now fully vaccinated. Currently, 52.18% of Japan's population has been boosted compared to 30.20% in the US, according to data fom Nikkei/The Financial Times. As of April 28, the total number of COVID-19 cases stood at 7,767,997 in Japan, and 81,189,379 in the United States, according to the Coronavirus Resource Center, Johns Hopkins University & Medicine.




Application for the 16th Japan International Manga Award Now Available
