Attends G7, NATO Summits

On June 26, Prime Minister Kishida attended the G7 Summit in Elmau, Germany. He also held bilateral meetings with his fellow G7 leaders, including US President Joe Biden.

Next, he attended the NATO 2022 Summit held June 28-30 in Spain, becoming the first Japanese prime minister to attend a NATO meeting.



Japan Elected as UN Security Council Non-Permanent Member

On June 9, was elected as a non-permanent member of the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) at the elections of the UN General Assembly and will serve a two-year term in the UNSC starting from January 1, 2023. Japan will assume membership on the UNSC for the 12th time since joining the UN in 1956, which is more than any other UN Member State. Japan will aim to maintain and strengthen the international order based on the rule of law, while cooperating in order for the UNSC to fulfill its expected role, through close communication and careful dialogue with other Member States, according to a statement issued by Foreign Minister HAYASHI Yoshimasa.

Latest on COVID-19 in Japan: Vaccinations Up

In Japan, over 284 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines have been administered to date to the general public as of June 27, 2022 with 80.87% of the population now fully vaccinated. Currently, 61.35% of Japan's population has been boosted compared to 31.60% in the US, according to data fom Nikkei/The Financial Times. As of June 27, cumulative COVID-19 cases totaled 9,241,386 in Japan, and 86,967,639 in the United States, according to the Coronavirus Resource Center, Johns Hopkins University & Medicine.

The 15th Annual VerdeXchange Conference Wrap-up!

The Consulate has been an active supporter of the VerdeXchange Conference since its inception, and this year Consul General Muto hosted the annual kick-off reception on Sunday June 19th for scores of VIP attendees, including US

Congressman Mike Levin, State Senator Robert Hertzberg, California Air Resources Board Chair Liane Randolph, California Energy Commission Vice-Chair Siva Gunda, and many other esteemed guests too numerous to list. Japanese companies were featured at the reception and the VerdeXchange Conference in Los Angeles over the next two days (June 20-21), with a special emphasis on the activities of the Japan Hydrogen Forum members, working here in the US to establish a viable hydrogen energy sector and a Hydrogen Society. Select LA Investment Summit Highlights Japan's Foreign Investment

Consul General Muto joined the SelectLA Investment Summit to offer his views on the decarbonizing of the global economy, from Japan's perspective, joining the Consuls

General of the United Kingdom and Mexico in that discussion. <u>In addition, the annually</u> <u>updated report on Foreign Direct Investment in California, Southern California and Los</u> <u>Angeles County was released</u>, showing Japan still in the top slot as largest investor nation. Japanese FDI creates an estimated 105,053 direct jobs in California statewide, with an estimated annual payroll of over \$10 billion. In Southern California alone, Japanese investment creates an estimated 74,486 direct jobs, at an annual payroll of over \$7.4 billion.



LA-Nagoya Sister Ports Hold 2nd Annual Sustainability Conference

Guided by the MOU of March 2020 signed by the Sister Ports of Los Angeles and Nagoya, on June 15th 2022, the 2nd Annual Sustainability Conference was convened virtually, with top leadership of the respective ports discussing their continued cooperative efforts on ports automation and sustainability, including the effort to decarbonize ports activities with hydrogen energy resources. Consul General Muto offered remarks at the conference, followed by intensive discussions and progress reports on the many important areas of collaboration undertaken by the Sister Ports.
