US Speaker of the House Meets with Prime Minister Kishida

On Aug. 5, Prime Minister KISHIDA Fumio hosted a breakfast meeting with a delegation led by Nancy Pelosi, Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, during their visit to

Japan. Discussed topics included strengthening the Japan-U.S. Alliance and a "Free and Open Indo-Pacific."



Prime Minister Kishida's US Visit

On Aug. 1, Prime Minister Kishida delivered a speech at the Tenth Review Converence of the Parties to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT) at the United Nations.

To work towards a world without nuclear weapons, he unveiled the "Hiroshima Action Plan," which is rooted in five actions, including a call for nuclear-weapon States to enhance the transparency of their nuclear forces and to maintain the decreasing trend of global nuclear stockpile. To promote the accurate understanding of the realities of nuclear

weapons use, Japan will also encourage visits to Hiroshima and Nagasaki by international leaders and others. Read his statement HERE.

Guidance on Japan's Border Control Measures Related to COVID-19

From midnight (Japan Standard Time) on Sept. 7 2022, all cross-border travelers and returnees from the US with <u>a valid vaccination certificate of COVID-19</u> will be <u>no longer required to submit the certificate of negative test result of pre-departure COVID-19 test within 72 hours prior to departure from the original country/region.</u>

Online Visa Applications for Eligible Applicants

All foreign nationals who wish to newly enter Japan need to apply for a visa except for those with a re-entry permit. From Aug. 18, Canadian nationals and US nationals are able to apply for a short-term stay visa for the purpose of Business, Visiting Relatives, and Tourism (only guided tours organized by a travel agency that serves as the receiving organization) through the JAPAN eVISA system.

Latest on COVID-19 in Japan

In Japan, over 315.4 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines have been administered to date to the general public as of Sept. 1, 2022 with 81.20% of the population now fully vaccinated. As of Sept. 1, cumulative COVID-19 cases totaled 19,099,600 in Japan, and

94,613,764 in the United States, according to the Coronavirus Resource Center, Johns Hopkins University & Medicine.
