Consul General Receives Briefing About Sumitomo Electric's Power Technology

The New Energy and Industrial Technology

Development Organization (NEDO), a Japanese
government agency, has been conducting since

September 2015 a demonstration project in San

Diego utilizing a Redox Flow (RF) battery, with Sumitomo Electric Industries, Ltd. as the contractor. An RF battery is a stationary storage battery with long life that is suitable for large-scale applications. A microgrid was constructed as part of the actual power distribution network, and the demonstration operation was successfully conducted as a countermeasure against natural disasters and planned/rotational power outages. This marks the first time in Japan and the U.S. that a microgrid has been constructed and operated using storage batteries as a power source in an actual power distribution

network in anticipation of power outages. Sumitomo Electric presented the technology at DISTRIBUTECH International 2023 held Feb 7-9 in San Diego.
