

## <u>Conferment Ceremony of</u> <u>Foreign Minister's</u> <u>Commendation for Mr. Toshio</u> <u>Ueno</u>

On Dec. 6, Consul General Sone hosted the Conferment Ceremony of Foreign Minister's

Commendation for Mr. Toshio Ueno in recognition of his activities promoting Japanese culture in the U.S. Mr. Ueno, who is also a Goodwill Ambassador to Promote Japanese Cuisine, helped found the Sake School of America in 2010. As the Executive Instructor, he conducts certification programs and has helped over 2,800 people become certified sake sommeliers and shochu advisors. Mr. Ueno has been a judge at sake competitions around the world and also organized competitions and certification courses outside of the U.S.

#### <u>'Perfect Days' on Academy Awards</u> Shortlist for International Feature Film

On Dec. 21, the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences announced shortlists in 10 categories for the 96th Academy Awards. Japan's 'Perfect Days,' a co-production between Japan and Germany directed by Wim Wenders and starring Koji Yakusho made the shortlist in the International Feature Film Category. Others in the running affiliated with Japan or Japanese talent include 'The Boy

and the Heron' in the Music (Original Score) category; 'Godzilla Minus One' in the Visual Effects category, and 'Maestro' in the Makeup and Hairstyling category (Mr. Kazuhiro Tsuji).



#### <u>'Boy and the Huron' Wins a</u> <u>Golden Globe</u>

The 2024 Golden Globes were held Jan. 7, with Hayao Miyazaki's 'The Boy and the Heron' winning the Golden Globe for Motion Picture - Animated. It beat out another favorite from Japan, 'Suzume,'

written and directed by Makoto Shinkai in the Animated Motion Picture category.
