Promoting Expo 2025 and MYAKU-MYAKU

On Feb. 25, the Expo 2025 Osaka, Kansai, Japan Business Seminar and Networking Reception was held at the Miyako Hotel Los Angeles, hosted by the Japan Association for the 2025 World Exposition and cohosted by the Consulate General of Japan in Los Angeles. Consul General Sone gave opening remarks and Japanese companies provided a preview of their technology and exhibits for the Expo, while MYAKU-MYAKU made a special appearance during the reception.

MYAKU-MYAKU is a mysterious creature created from the fusion of cells and water. MYAKU means "pulse" in Japanese, and the red design represents "cells," which divide and multiply.

The blue part represents "pure water," which can flow and change shape. To promote Expo 2025, MYAKU-MYAKU visited Little Tokyo and USC.
